

SAFE'S RECOMMENDATIONS

The six projects SAFE recommends FAA and industry undertake to improve GA training, in a nutshell, are:



- **BETTER ACCIDENT ROOT CAUSE ANALYSIS:**

This project focuses on analyzing accidents to determine root causes rather than just the final events or factors that created the smoking hole in the ground.

- **IMPROVING THE FLIGHT REVIEW:**

To reach the existing pilot population with better recurrent training, new options would be created in lieu of “one size fits all” flight reviews and Wings programs.

- **MODERNIZING FAA TRAINING DOCTRINE AND STANDARDS:**

The objective here is to continue and complete the modernization of FAA handbooks and then reform the knowledge test and practical test standards (PTS).

- **IMPROVING FLIGHT INSTRUCTOR PERFORMANCE:**

Recognizing that better flight instructors are essential, this project focuses on better instructor training, initial certification and renewal.

- **CREATING A FLIGHT INSTRUCTOR ACCREDITATION PROGRAM:**

Just like new teachers who must become accredited after receiving their degrees, this project seeks to create an instructor accreditation program to increase professionalism.

- **IMPROVING CURRICULA AND THE TRAINING DELIVERY SYSTEM:**

The previous five projects will only be effective when the training delivery system (curricula, simulation, courseware, facilities, aircraft) is improved and optimized to address safety issues.
